# Chapter 33 - Post 9/11 GI Bill®

## How do I qualify for CH 33 and when can I use it?

- To qualify you must serve at least 90 days of qualifying active duty on or after
  11 SEP 2001. Qualifying active duty is defined as:
  - Service in an active component
  - Mobilization or other active service in a reserve component under:
    - Title 10 USC, Sections 688, 12301(a), 12301(d), 12301(g), 12301(h),
      12302, 12304, 12304a, and 12304b
  - Title 10 AGR or Title 32 AGR, including One Time Occasional Tours (OTOT)
  - Title 32 ADOS for National Emergencies declared by the President only:
    - In Support of Operation Noble Eagle 11 SEP 01 31 MAY 02
    - Southwest Border/Operation Guardian Shield 15 FEB 19 20 JAN 21
    - In Support of COVID-19 Pandemic 20 MAR 20 1 JUL 22
    - U.S. Capitol Security and Inauguration 14 JAN 21 23 MAY 21
  - Basic Training and/or AIT can be added to qualifying time only if:
    - You have completed 24 months of qualifying active service; and
    - Your Basic Training and/or AIT was completed after 11 SEP 01
- The following duty does NOT qualify for Chapter 33:
  - Title 32 ADOS/ADSW other than described above
  - Title 10 service under a USC not listed above
  - Active-duty service to satisfy a service academy or ROTC obligation
  - o Active-duty service to satisfy obligation for Active-Duty Loan Repayment
  - Active-duty period which received a less than Honorable discharge
- Period to use the benefit following active-duty service varies:
  - o <u>15 years</u> following active duty that was completed BEFORE 1 JAN 2013
  - o No end date for active duty completed ON OR AFTER 1 JAN 2013

### What are the Payment Tiers?

Active Duty Service	Percentage
At least 36 cumulative months*	100%
At least 30 days and discharged for service-connected disability	100%
Purple Heart Recipients	100%
At least 30 cumulative months*	90%
At least 24 cumulative months*	80%
At least 18 cumulative months	70%
At least 6 cumulative months	60%
At least 90 cumulative days	50%

<sup>\*</sup>May include Basic Training and AIT if completed after 11 SEP 2001

#### How do the payments work?

- Tuition and Fees
  - Pays the payment tier percentage for in-state tuition to the school
    - Max payment of \$28,937/year for a private or foreign school
    - Max payment of \$16,535/year for flight training
- Book Stipend
  - \$41.67 per credit hour, up to \$1,000/yr (payment tier applies)
- Housing Stipend:
  - Must be attending more than ½ time
  - Equivalent to BAH of E5 with dependents for school's zip code
    (Compare schools here- <a href="https://www.va.gov/gi-bill-comparison-tool">https://www.va.gov/gi-bill-comparison-tool</a>)
    - If attending solely online, ½ national average (\$1,177/mo)
    - If attending a foreign school, \$2,355/mo.
  - o Payment tier percentage and rate of pursuit applies
  - Soldiers currently serving on qualifying active-duty orders (including AGRs) are NOT eligible for Housing Stipend at that time.

# How do I apply?

- Apply online at- <u>www.va.gov/education/how-to-apply/</u> (4-6 weeks to process)
- Notify school's veterans office you plan to use GI Bill
- Verify you monthly attendance- <a href="https://gibill.va.gov/wave/">https://gibill.va.gov/wave/</a>
- Stipends are tax free, direct deposited by Dept. of Veteran's Affairs

## Can I use Federal TA or State TA and my Post 9-11 GI Bill at the same time?

• Yes. Post 9-11 GI Bill pays its tuition percentage last after both tuition programs.
