## **Spouse & Dependent Educational Assistance Programs**

### Post 9/11 GI Bill, Transfer of Education Benefits (TEB)

- Soldiers who have earned Post 9/11 GI Bill from gualifying active duty and have at least 6 years of service may transfer up to 36 months of benefit to their spouse and children. May be use towards-

#### My Career Advancement Account (MyCAA) Scholarship

Spouses of Soldiers serving on active duty may qualify for assistance of up to \$4,000 per year towards licenses, certifications, CLEP, and associates degrees. https://mycaa.militaryonesource.mil/mycaa/

#### Student Loan Repayment

- Enlisted Soldiers may contract for repayment of up to \$50,000 towards their federal education loans.

#### **Dependents of Disabled and Deceased Service Members**

- Chapter 35 Dependents Education Assistance (DEA)
  - For dependents of service members with 100% service-connected disability or died on active duty.
  - Pays up to \$1,488/mo to a spouse or child (up to age 31) <u>https://www.va.gov/education/survivor-dependent-benefits/dependents-education-assistance/</u>
- Fry Scholarship
  - For dependents of service members who died in the line of duty or died from service-connected disability
  - Awards 36 months of Post 9/11 GI Bill to each dependent at 100% tier rate <u>https://www.va.gov/education/survivor-dependent-benefits/fry-scholarship/</u>
- Kentucky Tuition Waiver
  - For dependents of service members meeting one of the below:
    - 100% service-connected disability
    - Totally disabled veteran with wartime service
    - Died on active duty or from a service-connected disability
    - Any deceased veteran who served during a wartime period
  - Provides tuition-free attendance of any Kentucky public college or university <u>https://veterans.ky.gov/Benefits/Pages/Education-for-Veterans-in-Kentucky.aspx</u>
