COVID-19 VACCINE INFO

COVID-19 VACCINE INFO: COL Christopher C. Howell, OIC KYARNG COVID-19 Vaccination Response Team

As I continue to read and study from various medical resources regarding the number of Americans who are getting one of the COVID-19 vaccinations, it brings me a sense of hope. Hope, that as a nation, we are realizing that together we are stronger, but fractured we are weaker.

On the opposite spectrum, I look at the number of COVID-19 cases in the US which as of today has been 32, 481,455. The number of deaths is approaching 582,000 and FULLY vaccinated people in the United States is over 114 million. 114 million is a large number but it is only slightly over 34% of the US population. I ask myself why is that number so low when researchers have estimated that 75%-85% of the population needs to be immune to the coronavirus to stop the spread and end this pandemic.

As a health care provider, my main concern is the millions of Americans who have not received the vaccine for various reasons. This concern stems from new day to day studies that demonstrate long term health complications months after someone has been infected with COVID-19, even though they were initially asymptomatic. Throughout this past year, it has become clear that COVID-19 is a disease that affects all organ systems. The most affected are the brain, lungs, heart, kidneys and intestines.

A recent study of more than 200,000 post-COVID patients demonstrated that one in three survivors suffered from neurological or psychiatric disability six months after infection. 1 in 3 folks and a portion of these showed no initial symptoms. They were young, healthy and were going about their day-to-day activities. Now, they are struggling to hold a conversation with their friends or they are finding it difficult to nurture a relationship with their loved ones. Depression and anxiety worsened and those with PTSD suffered greatly. This cognitive decline is believed to be a result of the continuous activation of the immune system resulting in persistent inflammation. Inflammation that just doesn't go away, it lingers and festers.

The heart and the vascular system has been two of the most studied systems that have been negatively affected by COVID-19. Various studies have concluded that the blood vessels of young adults suffer changes to their heart's functional capabilities within three to four weeks of infection. There is evidence of coronavirus patients experiencing heart damage, cardiomyopathy (a heart disease which can cause the heart muscle to become weaker), arrhythmias, decreased ejection fractions (a metric for determining the heart's pumping capacity) and arterial and venous occlusions (clots in the arteries or veins). Again, more and more of these conditions are being seen in previously asymptomatic **previously healthy**, **young** people.

These side effects that are mentioned are just a few of the long term affects one could suffer after getting COVID-19. More are sure to emerge as time goes. The science and medical communities do not know the extent to which COVID-19 will affect people 1 year or 3 years from now, but it is known unequivocally that getting vaccinated will significantly reduce your chances of getting COVID-19. Everyone who gets vaccinated does so for a reason—to protect themselves and their family, or to safely get back to activities like seeing friends, resuming work, or returning to school. Still, some people are hesitant to get their COVID-19 vaccine. COVID-19 vaccines are new, and it's expected for people to have questions about them. Please understand that the temporary discomfort you may experience when you get vaccinated, pales in comparison to the agony you may undergo if you do not get the vaccine and you get the infection.

If you can do this AARP card carrying Soldier a favor and please heed these words, understand the implications and **get vaccinated**. If you can put aside your doubts, than as a unified force, we can continue to decrease our chances and those we love from suffering such devastating, long term side effects.



When reviewing your record for the EPS cycle, ensure iPERMS and IPPS-A are up to date and match. For example, if you have an AAM in iperms, make sure that has been added to IPPS-A. Same with skills, qualifications, and education level.



IPPS-A

- IPPS-A Release 3 will go live on 21 December 2021.

- As HR Professionals, be prepared to complete 40 additional distance learning hours to include a 40 hour in-person training in November (dates and locations TBD). <u>Subject to change</u>, there will be an IPPS-A brownout period (no IPPS-A transactions during this timeframe) from 24 November to 20 December 2021.

- IPPS-A Release 3 HR Professional distance learning training is now available (with caveats). For HR Professionals, you have the option to 1) self-enroll into this training or 2) wait until our G-1 HR Systems Branch Training Resource Administrators (TRA) enroll all HR Professionals in IPPS-A throughout this month. CAVEAT: To date, not all distance learning modules are available.

- If HR Professionals choose to self-enroll now, below are the procedures:

- From the IPPS-A Self Service Home page, click on the IPPS-A Hands-on Training tile.
- Search "R3 HR Professional" under "Programs."
- select the R3 HR Professional with the award ribbon beside it.
- On the top right, click "Register," then select your Job Title and click "Submit."
- On the left side, you will notice the program details. All available chapters <u>not marked</u>
 "Coming Soon" are available to take. As a default, all chapters will say "Not Enrolled."
 Click on any of the available chapters to enroll and begin training. Once you click the
 chapter, there will be a box in the center of the screen. Click on "Enroll," then "Go to
 Course" and "Launch."

* Note: Some training chapters are videos while some require you to complete the step-bystep "try it" exercises.

<u>SIBx</u>

- The SIBx application (SIBx Web, SIBx Hub, SIBx ABS) for KY is scheduled to sunset on 31 July 2021. This is primarily due to the Oracle license for APEX (the web piece of Oracle) it requires and the lack of funding to continue using it. We will begin testing the CRM HR ticket process for actions that are currently used in SIBx Hub with a small Brigade very soon. Once testing begins, we will continue testing for 4 weeks. If testing goes well, we will begin using the CRM HR ticket process for legacy SIBx Hub actions, therefore eliminating the need for SIBx Hub altogether. We are currently looking at options for Automated Board Systems.

<u>G-1 SOP</u>

- The G-1 has begun the journey to update the G-1 SOP by individual processes from each section (Officer Branch, Enlisted Branch, HR Systems Branch and Education and Incentives Branch). This SOP will be based off the IPPS-A User Manual. As G-1 branches are disseminating updated processes to the BDE S-1s, please ensure it is being reviewed by the units, BN and BDE S-1s. Your input is crucial to the success of our G-1 SOP and will provide future assistance to all Readiness NCOs, Battalion and Brigade S-1s throughout the state.

G-1 Desktop Reference

- The G-1 desktop references have been removed from the G-1 GKO Sharepoint and transferred to the IPPS-A file share here: \\NGKYA7-A01-SHR0\J1_Boards\IPPS-A\G1_Desktop_Reference_(Historical). We will keep these files available until the G-1 SOP has been finalized.

This will ensure Soldiers have been keyed into IPPS-A with the correct TMP ASG EAD assignment and reflect the correct codes and UIC for their mission. Additionally, this (IPPS-A transaction) will feed DEERS for Tricare eligibility.
