Military Service Deposit

What is a Military Service Deposit?

Federal employees who completed qualifying active-duty service may choose to purchase that time in order for it to count towards their Federal Employees Retirement (FERS), raising their FERS annuity when they later retire.

What active duty qualifies towards FERS?

To qualify, the active service must meet specific criteria:

- Title 10 active duty performed <u>prior</u> to technician start, or
- Title 10 or Title 32 active duty performed <u>during</u> technician service where the employee was coded Absent-Uniform Services (ABSENT-US)
- The following periods do NOT qualify:
 - State active-duty (SAD) missions
 - o Periods that did not result in a discharge under honorable conditions
 - Periods with Uncharacterized discharges (e.g. IADT)

What does it cost?

Employees pay a deposit equal to a percentage of their active-duty basic pay received. All other allowances, combat pay, etc, are not included in the calculation.

• For T10 service performed <u>prior</u> to technician start:

Date of Service	Cost to Purchase
1 JAN 57 – 31 DEC 98	3.00%
1 JAN 99 – 31 DEC 99	3.25%
1 JAN 00 – 31 DEC 00	3.40%
1 JAN 01 - Present	3.00%

o Example: 1 year service in 2012 as E5, \$32,000; today costs \$960 plus interest

- For T10/T32 service performed during technician employment, you may pay:
 - The percentage of your active basic pay as listed above, or
 - The applicable FERS withholding for your technician salary for that period.
 Your FERS withholding is determined by when you first started as a tech:

Technician Start	FERS Withholding
1 JAN 87 – 31 DEC 12	0.8% (FERS)
1 JAN 13 – 31 DEC 13	3.1% (FERS RAE)
1 JAN 14 - Present	4.4% (FERS FRAE)

- o Example: GS07 step 5, leaves to complete 1-year active duty in 2012 as E5:
 - Costs \$960 plus interest (3% of \$32,000 active pay), or
 - Costs \$352 plus interest (0.8% of \$44,000 technician salary)

Can I wait and do this before I retire?

- While you may complete the purchase anytime while employed, compound interest is not applied if you make the payment within the first 3 years it is available to you.
- Employees cannot start a new military service deposit if one is underway.
- All payments must be completed before separation.

What is the process to buy my time?

- Eligible employees can buy their active service at any time while employed.
- Deposit may be paid in monthly installments or lump sum.
- To begin the process:
 - Gather DD214s for active service:
 - Ensure they include character of service (e.g. Honorable Discharge)
 - Member-4 and Service-2 copies show character of service.
 - Send to HRO for cost estimate and application processing.
 - o DFAS will mail a debt letter in approximately 60 days to finalize election.

Can I purchase service that counts towards an active-duty retirement?

Active-duty service may not count for an active-duty military retirement and a technician retirement. Active service purchased for FERS is not credited to an active retirement.
